WFTDA Says...

You may notice something different about your favorite derby players' number this season. According to the new WFTDA rule effective this year, the player number may no longer include alphabetic characters. In addition, the new rule increases the minimum size for jersey numbers from 4 inches to 6 inches and requires that all numbers are printed in the same size. Players will still be able to have small characters preceding or following their skater number on their uniform, but these small characters are not considered part of their number and they may in no way affect the legibility of the number. It also states that these small characters may not be any larger than 2 inches.

to the directions of their coaches like little soldiers; every stop, start turn and, weave was done with precision at the sound of the whistle. It was fun just watching the warm-ups.

The players were divided into black & white jerseys and received instructions as to how skater skill levels would be managed throughout the scrimmage. Then they went to their benches for a quick bit of last minute coaching. Finally, they heard the sounds they had been waiting for...a whistle followed by "thirty seconds!" For many of them this was their first time taking the track in a real scrimmage, yet they all seemed to be so calm and collected. And when the jam starting whistle sounded and they began game play, you would never have known that these kids were so new to this sport. The skill level rotations and combinations made it possible for everyone to play a variety of positions. The jammers were finding holes, making their own holes, juking, spinning, and creating ways to score points. The positional blocking was outstanding, the hits were made with purpose, and the blockers were communicating and recycling. At the end of each jam the players came off the floor ready to listen to what their coaches had to say so that they could get back out there on the floor and do it again.

As I watched these youngsters play I was completely impressed with how much they have accomplished. Watching their coaches, it was obvious how proud they were of their students. These coaches should be very proud of how far they have brought our junior derby program. I can't wait to see what they will accomplish in 2016.
